

The scientific journal titled “Quaderni del Museo di Storia Naturale di Livorno” publishes yearly works covering every naturalistic aspects in the Livorno territory and in the Mediterranean area. Manuscripts must be in Italian or in English. Manuscripts have to be submitted in both digital and paper forms to the following address:

SUBMISSION AND REVIEWING PROCESS

The manuscript must include the names of the authors together with their mailing address, telephone number and, eventually, fax number and e-mail. In the case of manuscripts co-authored by more than one author, a corresponding author has to be designated and indicated to the Editorial Office. The manuscripts are peer-reviewed by international referees. If accepted, reviewed manuscripts are returned to the authors for eventual modifications according to referees' suggestions.

MANUSCRIPT STRUCTURE

The organization of the papers (with the exclusion of brief notes) is the following: Title, authors (please, indicate the name and address of each authors including their e-mail addresses), the corresponding author (together with address and e-mail), an abstract of around 150 words in the language of the authors and an English translation of the abstract, a minimum of 3 key words, Introduction, Material(s) and Method(s), Results, Discussion (Results and Discussion can be included in the same paragraph), Conclusion(s), Acknowledgements (if necessary), Literature cited in the text and, finally, a longer and detailed summary in English (Extended Abstract). Captions of figures and plates must be reported after the Extended Abstract and must be organized as follows: Fig.1 – Text of the figure caption; Tab. 1 – Text of the table caption. If the language of the manuscript is not English, the captions must include the text in the language of the manuscript and a corresponding translation in English. Figures and Tables are independent series and have to be cited in the text accordingly. Graphs may be submitted also in Excel files (extension .xls). The file including the main text must have the .doc or .rtf extensions; the font must be Times New Roman; the text must be unformatted; words in Latin must be written in Italic.

FIGURES AND PLATES

Figures and plates must be provided in separate files. Files including figures and plates must be in TIFF format with a minimum definition of 300 dpi. These files must be unambiguously associated to the corresponding captions. Figure width can be 8 cm or 17 cm; the maximum height is 17 cm. A photocopy or a print of each figure or plate has to be submitted together with the paper copy of the manuscript. Line drawings or reproductions of specimens or details of specimens must include a dimensional bar with reference to the measurements taken. Authors must use the units included in the International System. The Editorial Office will have the final decision on the definitive size of figures and plates. All the figures and plates will be published in halftone (black and white, grey scale) free of charge. Published paper may include color figures and plates but the cost of printing color figures must be paid in full by the authors. Authors must ask the Editorial Office if they want to publish color figures and must declare that they will be responsible for the payment of the costs.

In the case of web sites, the manuscripts must report the author followed by the year of publication of the site in the world wide web (if available) and, separately, the principal web site hosting the visited site as in the following example: (Stevens, 2001), (Missouri Botanical Garden, web site).

ACCEPTED MANUSCRIPTS, PROOFS, AND REPRINTS

Once the manuscript is accepted, the Editorial Office proceeds to format the text in the definitive form. The corresponding authors will receive a single proof for corrections that has to be sent back to the Editorial Office in 15 days from the receipt. If authors exceed 15 days then the publication of their paper could be delayed and the work could appear in a subsequent issue of the journal. The proofs must be considered as definitive and only minor corrections are permitted. Substantial addition, reduction or change to the text is not allowed.

Each author or author group will receive 20 reprints free of charge. A higher number of reprints must be explicitly asked to the Editorial Office.
